OVERALL MANDATE

The overall mandate of NaMED is to create an effective national institutional framework to monitor and evaluate Government and donor funded projects as well as the National Development Plan.

FUNCTIONS

- ◆ Lead the monitoring and evaluation of all public sector and donor-funded policies, programmes, and projects;
- ◆ Design and implement a National Monitoring System that links the monitoring units in Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs), and Local Councils (LCs);
- ◆ Develop monitoring guidelines and manuals for use by all MDAs and LCs and support their capacity building needs to effectively undertake monitoring and evaluation;
- ◆ Track and record progress of implementation of all government and donor funded projects as well as the National Development Plan (NDP) using modern and appropriate technology;
- ◆ Conduct special studies on various aspects of public sector policies, programmes, and projects;
- ◆ Lead the conduct of independent baseline studies, mid-term, and final evaluation of all projects;
- ◆ Establish and maintain a database on all completed and on-going projects.



VISION

A Sierra Leone where all public sector policies, programmes, and projects, at national and sub national levels, produce value for money and are subject to an independent, integrated, institutionalized, and well-coordinated M&E system that ensures improved development results, accountability, transparency, and learning.

MISSION

To facilitate, influence, and support effective planning, budgeting, monitoring and evaluation of government policies, programmes, and projects aimed at improving service delivery with positive impact on society.

VALUES

Monitoring and Evaluation shall at all times be responsive and exemplary. This includes commitment to the following set of core values:

PRINCIPLES

The following shall form the guiding principles of NaMED:

◆ Inclusion and Participation

Monitoring and evaluation activities shall be inclusive of all stakeholders and conducted in a consultative and participatory manner.

◆ Evidence-based decision-making.

There shall be a national M&E results framework for enhancing the generation of quality M&E evidence.

◆ Managing for development results

M&E shall be guided by national priorities and aligned with the National Development Plan (NDP). It shall be focused on measuring the expected results outlined in public policies, programmes, and projects.

◆ Ethics, integrity, and professionalism

The professionalism and integrity of monitors and evaluators shall demonstrate impartiality and objectivity. The confidentiality of institutions and individuals who provide information shall be guaranteed at all times.

◆ Transparency and accountability

Institutions and individuals who receive public funds shall account for them based on agreed targets linked to the MTNDP and other development priorities. All MDAs, LCs, and development partners to strictly adhere to good practice of accountability and transparency in achieving results

◆ Value for money

Ensure efficient and effective use of public funds to archive results that positively impacts the lives.
